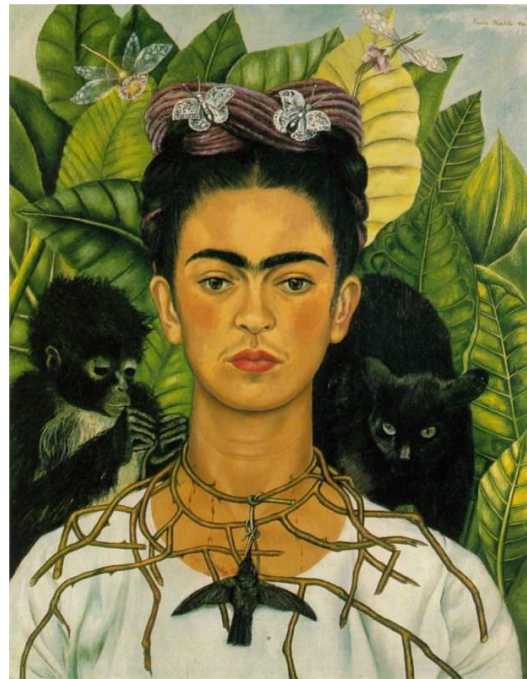
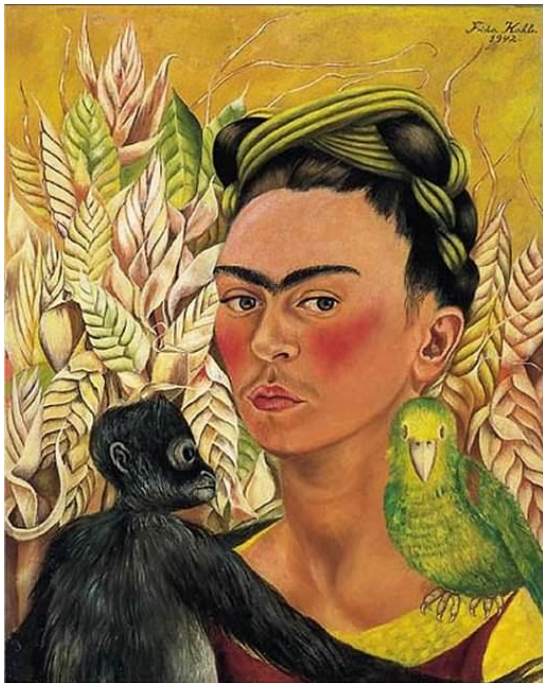


Image A: Self-Portrait with Monkey and Parrot

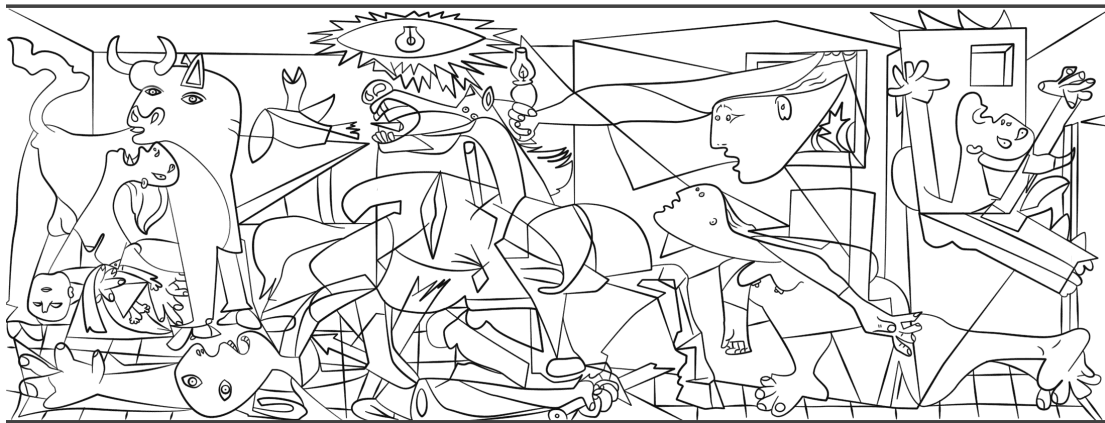
