The 100 Men March, which is making its way through Pretoria on Tuesday, is aimed at raising awareness of violence against women and children in the country.

Government representatives and supporters from various other sectors of society such as lawyers, judges, clergy from diverse faith movements, police, nurses and other civil servants, bikers, as well as members of the National Taxi Alliance, are marching in support of ending gender violence and abuse.

"The 100 Men March seeks to highlight the negative impact of violence against women and children on South African society," acting director-general of the Government Communication and Information System (GCIS) Phumla Williams said.

"Marshals in clearly marked regalia will assist in ensuring the smooth movement of participants through the city," she said.

"Metro police from the City of Tshwane will close certain roads at certain times to ensure that the marchers move speedily through the city."

Euthanasia advocate Sean Davison arrested for performing “mercy killing”

Sean Davison shot to infamy when he performed a mercy killing on his mother in 2011. Now, he's been arrested for Euthanasia once more.

Euthanasia in South Africa

Sean Davison, a leading right-to-die activist and supporter of legal euthanasia, has been arrested for the 2013 “murder” of quadriplegic doctor, Anrich Burger.

Davison – who performed a “mercy killing” on his terminally-ill mother in the last decade – was taken into custody on Tuesday night, in connection with the death of the 43-year-old doctor. Burger lost the use of all his limbs after an accident in 2005.

He’s a professor at the University of the Western Cape and rose to infamy back in 2010 when he carried out the mercy killing of his 85-year-old mom in New Zealand. She had been diagnosed with incurable cancer.

Davison wrote a book about his mother’s final few years of suffering, where he made the shock confession of feeding her a lethal dose of morphine so she could “pass on”. The Dunedin High Court eventually charged him with assisted suicide, which put him under house arrest for five months.

After returning to South Africa, Davison was contacted by Dr Burger, who was desperate for his assistance. He reasoned that he helped the 43-year-old die because of the “extreme pain” he was suffering, and claimed his actions were out of “compassion for a close friend”.

However, euthanasia isn’t a legal practice in South Africa, and the local authorities have taken a dim view on Davison’s decision to take another life. The professor has been able to post R20 000 bail, and entered a “not guilty” plea to the court.

“It is and always has been my intention that I have not committed any offence as alleged in this matter,” his lawyer read from an affidavit.

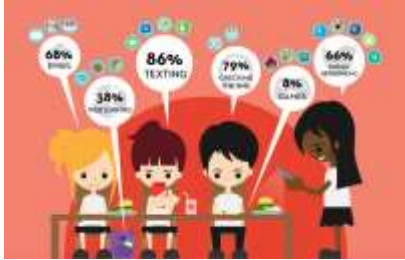
